 $\underline{\text{Subject:}}$ Coronavirus (COVID-19) – Accelerating digitalization of maritime trade and logistics – A call to action.

Excellency,

In response to IMO joint statement calling for intergovernmental collaboration to drive the acceleration of digitalization of maritime trade and logistics, we have the honor to present the following measures taken by <u>some of the Egyptian ports</u> as an example of our country's endeavor to accelerate the digitalization of ports system.

- 1- Video Conference feature is used in:
 - -The operational meetings between the port Administration and the port community.
 - -The Implementation of training programs for port personnel in cooperation with the Ports Training Institutes of Egypt.
 - Workshops organized by various entities.
- 2- The IT team of the Automated Dept. in the Egyptian Ports implements all tasks remotely by use of relevant programs in accordance with the instructions of cyber security.
- 3- The electronic platform of the Egyptian ports allows customers to carry out their work and view instant reports through:
 - a- Electronic Gate (submitting of : anchorage requests- stevedoring requests- departure requests- FAL forms- pre-booking containers- inquiry about ship bills automatically- Contacting government agencies to inquire about several requests such as the commercial register and the tax card).
 - b- Phone applications diverted to customers special alert messages (ship arrival and departure billing).
 - c- Mobile applications for port authority employees to inquire about (leave balance attendance and leave -description of salary).
- 4- MAXIMO program online reservation system for trucks calling at the ports is activated and used by clients.

- 5- Various online services are offered by ports to clients representing the second generation of the single window system.
- 6- Just in time (JIT) operation system is successfully carried out in Damietta Port Authority including about 1340 vessels calling at the port. As a result, a great reduction of costs and emissions are achieved.

We also like to assure you that Egypt, through the abovementioned measures, exerts its utmost to drive a change in this context to facilitate the flow of the international chain of supplies. We reemphasize that the aforementioned procedures are applied in some of the Egyptian ports and efforts are underway to put them to use in all Egyptian ports.

Therefore, we kindly request the IMO Secretariat to circulate the abovementioned information among Member States.

The Egyptian Maritime Transport Sector avails itself of this opportunity to renew to your Excellency the assurances of its highest consideration.
